Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM)



Home: to most, it's our sanctuary.



However, for millions in America, the place they live is made even more dangerous under the social distancing restrictions imposed by the Coronavirus. We are facing a two-fold pandemic: COVID-19 and domestic violence. According to the CDC, 1 in 4 women and 1 in 10 men will experience intimate partner violence in their lifetime. Among the LGBTQIA+ community, individuals experience even higher levels of violence and have less access to resources and support. While official figures are yet to be determined, domestic violence shelters in the U.S. have reported increased numbers of calls from those wanting to access support and services since the pandemic started. Because of COVID-19 restrictions, options for safety planning and personal protective orders aren't as easily accessible, and nation-wide 'stay-in-place' mandates may be putting survivors in increasingly unsafe situations.

Despite the numerous obstacles this pandemic has posed, CARDV advocates have continued to support survivors during this difficult time—relocating them to safety, providing emergency shelter, safety planning and offering support through our 24-hr Crisis & Support Line and online chat advocacy. Now, more than ever, CARDV is bringing attention to the importance of 'safety at home' for Domestic Violence Awareness Month in October.

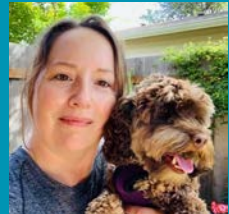
