For the Long Haul



Mary Zelinka has been involved with CARDV since its inception 40 years ago. She is a valued member of the staff, serving for 31 years. In 1979, Mary started as a volunteer. With only one paid staff in the early days, volunteers kept CARDV ticking. They answered the Hotline, responded to crises, welcomed survivors into shelter, ran support groups, and performed the clerical tasks.

Mary recalls one particular instance from those early years that had a big impact on her. Working as a volunteer, her task for the day was to help a Shelter Resident furnish a new safe home for her

family. Even though Mary was still working through her own survival process, she was ready for the task at hand, daunting as it seemed.

Thanks to generous community support, CARDV received so much donated furniture, offsite storage had to be used to hold it all. That is where Mary and "Sara" met. Both were a little overwhelmed with the idea of relying only on each other to make this happen, Sara and her family needed a house full of furniture. With a van and a station wagon and determination, they did it. They filled both vehicles to the top, tied mattresses on the roofs and they made three trips to the new home in Salem.

"What I noticed with each piece of furniture, was that Sara seemed to be getting 'bigger' and more self-confident. And, I realized that I did too," Mary recalled.

"By the time we finished, it was like we had spent our whole lives moving furniture together, it was that incredible. Then, I realized that CARDV was in this for the long haul."

Mary knew that the organization she loved was not just a crisis response team or shelter, and that is so critical to helping survivors. For many survivors it can take years, even a lifetime to regain what was stolen from them in those violent situations. She knew that CARDV was in it for the response and the shelter; she learned that the team was in it for the years to come. When survivors hit a snag, or are still processing and need support, Advocates would be available on the Hotline ready to help as long as is necessary. *"This is why I am still involved,"* she emphatically said.
